scholarly series

***Linguistica & Beyond.* Methodological and Interdisciplinary Perspectives in the Era of the Digital Turn**

The Institute of Polish Philology at the University of Gdańsk, the Institute of Linguistics at the University of Warmia and Mazury in Olsztyn, and the Faculty of Polish and Classical Philology at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań – in collaboration with the local branches of the Society of Friends of Polish Language in Gdańsk, Olsztyn, and Poznań – are honored to invite you to participate in a biennial conference series. These events will be hosted on a rotating basis across the co-organizing institutions' respective cities. The inaugural meeting will take place in

Gdańsk on November 5–6, 2026

The proposed conference series seeks to interrogate – through empirical, methodological, and epistemological lenses – the standing of linguistics within the broader academic landscape. We aim to collectively reflect on contemporary linguistic research methodologies and the far-reaching ramifications of the digital turn, which has catalyzed the intensive



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integration of digital tools and Large Language Models (LLMs) – technologies now widely encompassed by the term artificial intelligence (AI).

The digital and methodological revolution presents language scholars with unprecedented horizons: it enables the analysis of vast linguistic datasets and the formulation of research questions that were, until recently, beyond even philosophical speculation – *than are dreamt of in your philosophy*. Simultaneously, the current capacity for interdisciplinary inquiry allows for the elucidation of complex phenomena within our surrounding reality. In this light, a thorough re-appraisal of the standing of linguistics and its potential for cross-disciplinary synergy is imperative. Never before have Ingardenian "phenomena of reality" held such promise for multifaceted, interdisciplinary description. May this revolution not bypass the field of linguistics!

We invite proposals for papers addressing, but not limited to, the following thematic areas:

- Emergent phenomena in contemporary Polish and other languages;
- Monolingual and multilingual language corpora;
- Spoken and written language across diverse styles, text types, and speech genres;
- Language in media and public communication: discourse and argumentation in the social sphere – transformations, styles, and strategies;
- Digital and platform-mediated communication: new forms, genres, and linguistic practices;
- Interdisciplinary perspectives in linguistics: bridging the humanities, social sciences, and technology;
- The reconstruction of linguistic phenomena and processes using digital tools and AI;
- The scholarly and epistemological worldview at the intersection of diverse fields of knowledge.

We also welcome proposals for thematic panels (special sessions) and roundtables. Submissions should include a concise abstract, a rationale for the session, a proposed scope of topics, and a list of moderators and prospective speakers.

We trust that the conference ***Linguistica & Beyond. Methodological and Interdisciplinary Perspectives in the Era of the Digital Turn*** will foster a robust dialogue on linguistic inquiries within the digital age – spanning scholarly, social, and public spheres. May the words of Bernard of Chartres serve as the guiding motto for our recurring series of scholarly meetings: *We are like dwarfs perched on the shoulders of giants, and thus we see more and farther than they. This is not due to any keenness of our own sight or the prominence of our stature, but because we are carried aloft and elevated by their gigantic height.*

We intend to publish the conference proceedings in scholarly journals affiliated with the host academic institutions.

We accept conference participation applications until **30 September 2026** via the [registration form](#). Notification of paper acceptance will be sent by **5 October 2026**.

Once the paper has been accepted, participants are requested to pay the conference fee of **PLN 650 (EUR 150)** by **25 October 2026**. The fee covers organisational costs, lunches, the formal conference dinner, and a contribution towards publication costs.
